Determining the Appropriate Word Thief Level for a Student



There are five levels of Word Thief Sight Word Card Games:

- PrePrimer
- Primer
- First
- Second
- Third

The card games increase in difficulty from PrePrimer to Third. Follow the steps below to find the perfect level(s) for a student!

- 1. Download each list of words.
- 2. Starting with the PrePrimer level, ask the student to read each word aloud.
- 3. Mark a word as correct if a student reads it accurately, in 3 seconds or less.
- 4. Begin playing the game at a level where a student knows at least 30 of the words on the list.
- 5. Cards from different levels can be mixed together to create a custom deck of cards with the words a student needs to master.
